



Report on Community Outreach Initiative by MVJ College of Engineering: Distribution of Ration Kits to Underprivileged Families

NSS wing of MVJ College of Engineering (MVJCE) recently organized a commendable community outreach program to support underprivileged families residing in makeshift tent houses near the college on 30th October 2024. This initiative aimed to provide essential food supplies, addressing the basic nutritional needs of these families during difficult times.

Details of the Initiative

To alleviate the daily struggles faced by economically disadvantaged families, MVJCE distributed **500 ration kits** across five nearby locations. Each kit weighed approximately **12 kg** and included staple food items necessary for preparing balanced meals:

- **Rice:** 5 kg
- **Atta (Wheat Flour):** 1 kg
- **Dal (Lentils):** 1 kg
- **Onion:** 1 kg
- **Potato:** 1 kg
- **Salt:** 500 grams
- **Cooking Oil:** 1 liter
- **Chili Powder:** 500 grams
- **Sugar:** 1 kg

These thoughtfully curated kits aimed to meet the families' dietary requirements, providing them with essential ingredients for nutritious meals while ensuring a balanced diet.
