SWAYAM 2025: A Cultural Tapestry Unfolds at MVJ College of Engineering

SWAYAM 2025 not only upheld the legacy of MVJCE's cultural pursuits but also elevated the spirit of unity in diversity through its inclusive and immersive experiences.

A Grand Inauguration and Day 1 Highlights

The festivities began with a grand inauguration at the Dr. M.V Jayaraman Auditorium, graced by the presence of renowned Carnatic musician and Bharatanatyam dancer **Mrs. Sivasri Skandaprasad**, who was praised by the Prime Minister of India, Sri Narendra Modi for her beautiful rendition of her bhajans during the consecration ceremony of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya.

Event Wise Report on Swayam 2025

The *Painted Smiles* Face Painting Competition, organized by the Aakriti Club as part of the SWAYAM 2025 Cultural Fest, was held on 30th May 2025 at MVJ College of Engineering. The event aimed to provide a creative platform for students to express their artistic abilities through the medium of face painting, while also encouraging thematic interpretation and collaborative execution. The theme for the competition, "*Heritage on Wheels*", invited participants to explore and depict concepts related to heritage, mythology, mobility, and abstract art, thereby blending tradition with imagination.

The event was coordinated under the guidance of Faculty Coordinator Ms. Bini Babu, with student coordinators Anna Jovita and Khushi Patil overseeing the planning and execution. Each participating team consisted of one painter and one model, with a total of six participants from various institutions. The competition was conducted over a span of 2.5 hours, with an additional 30-minute buffer for final touches and submission. The registration fee was set at ₹300 per team.

Participants included students from MVJCE, Whitefield Global School, and Acharya College of Nursing, reflecting a diverse and inclusive participation. The judging criteria encompassed originality, relevance to the theme, color usage, brushwork technique, and overall visual appeal. The panel of judges evaluated each entry with fairness and attention to detail.

Debajyoti Biwas from Acharya College of Nursing was declared the winner for his outstanding interpretation and execution of the theme. He was awarded a certificate and a cash prize of ₹1,500. All other participants received appreciation certificates in recognition of their enthusiastic involvement and creative efforts.

The event was well-received by both participants and spectators, and it successfully highlighted the importance of artistic expression in fostering creativity and cultural awareness. *Painted Smiles* not only served as a platform for showcasing talent but also encouraged students to think innovatively and work collaboratively.

The *Pencil Perfection* competition, organized by the Aakriti, The Fine Arts Club, was held on 30th May 2025 at MVJ College of Engineering, in Room No. 314 of the Engineering Block. This solo pencil art competition aimed to celebrate the timeless elegance and expressive power of the pencil, encouraging students to explore creativity, mindfulness, and discipline through monochromatic artistry. The theme was "*Peacock's Tail Telling India's Story*", which inspired participants to depict cultural narratives through intricate pencil sketches.

A total of 10 students registered for the event. Participants adhered to the guidelines, using only pencil-based mediums such as graphite, charcoal, or colored pencils. Mechanical instruments and paints were strictly prohibited. The judging panel, led by Mr. Pulkit Sahni and supported by experienced faculty and alumni, evaluated the artworks based on creativity, detailing, theme interpretation, complexity, and neatness, with each criterion scored out of 10.

Hitesh Kumar was awarded the 1st Prize of ₹3,000 for his exceptional artwork that skillfully interpreted the theme with symbolic depth and visual harmony. Baby Shreyashi Ponnuru received the 2nd Prize of ₹1,500 for her technically refined and conceptually rich sketch. All other participants were felicitated with appreciation certificates in recognition of their dedication and artistic contributions.

The Waste to Wonders competition, organized by the Aakriti Fine Arts Club, was held on 30th May 2025 in Room No. 314 of the Engineering Block. This unique art and craft event aimed to promote sustainability through creativity by challenging participants to transform discarded materials into meaningful artistic creations. The theme, "Vase with Flowers," was revealed on the spot, encouraging spontaneous innovation and resourceful thinking. Four participants—Srushti V, Darshan, Lakshmi Bai, and Shweta, paerticipated in the event, each bringing their own waste materials such as newspapers, cardboard, and sticks. The judging panel, led by Mr. Pulkit Sahni, evaluated entries based on creativity, detailing, theme interpretation, complexity, and neatness, with each criterion scored out of 10. Darshan was declared the winner and awarded a cash prize of ₹2,000 for his exceptional craftsmanship and thematic clarity. All other participants received appreciation certificates. The event fostered a quiet, focused atmosphere and served as a therapeutic break during the high-energy fest. Waste to Wonders was one of the

most inspiring and environmentally conscious events of SWAYAM 2025, promoting mindfulness, creativity, and sustainability.

The *Doodle on Clay* competition, organized by the Aakriti Club was conducted on 31st May 2025 in Classroom 313 from 11:30 AM to 2:30 PM. This solo ceramic doodling event was designed to foster mental well-being through artistic expression, while also providing a platform for students to demonstrate their fine art skills, attention to detail, and creative discipline. Participants were required to use oil-based markers, ceramic pens, or waterproof liners to create original designs on clay surfaces, adhering strictly to the event's guidelines which emphasized originality, neatness, and thematic coherence.

The event was meticulously planned and executed by the Aakriti Club, with responsibilities ranging from conceptualization and promotion to logistics and on-site coordination. A total of six students from diverse academic disciplines participated, reflecting the inclusive and interdisciplinary nature of the event. Conducted on 31st May 2025 from 9:30 AM to 11:00 AM in Seminar Hall 2, the event provided a creative platform for passionate photographers to express their unique perspectives through the lens. Known for its dedication to storytelling and artistic expression, RaagAbhinaya extended its vision beyond the stage, embracing photography as a powerful medium of narrative and emotion.

The competition was centered around the theme "The Unseen Ordinary", encouraging participants to explore and capture the unnoticed beauty, emotion, and meaning hidden in

Conducted on 31st May 2025 from 11:30 AM to 1:00 PM in Seminar Hall 2, the event provided a stage for performers to explore the art of unscripted storytelling.

The competition was centered around the theme "Moments in Motion", celebrating the essence of improvisational theatre—quick thinking, adaptability, and real-time storytelling. Participants were given prompts and challenged to create engaging scenes on the spot, relying solely on their instincts, imagination, and teamwork. The event featured 11 registrations from various colleges, each bringing a unique blend of humor, drama, and creativity to the stage. The performances were judged on criteria such as originality, timing, character development, audience engagement, and overall impact.

Charlen and Team were declared the winners of the competition for their exceptional chemistry, comedic timing, and ability to build compelling narratives spontaneously. Heerath secured the runner-up position with a performance that stood out for its emotional depth and improvisational finesse. The winners were awarded **a** cash prize pool of ₹4,000 and ₹2,500, respectively, recognizing their talent and stagecraft.

The Short Film Making competition, organized by RaagAbhinaya—the Theatre and Production Club of MVJ College of Engineering—was a compelling and creatively rich event held as part of SWAYAM 2025. Conducted on 31st May 2025 from 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM in Seminar Hall 2, the event provided a platform for aspiring filmmakers to showcase their storytelling, direction, and technical skills through short-format cinema.

The competition was centered around the theme "One Minute Late", challenging participants to craft impactful narratives within a strict time limit of 6 minutes and 10 seconds. A total of 11 teams registered, with 9 submitting their final entries. Each film offered a unique interpretation of the theme, exploring ideas of missed opportunities, time, regret, and fate. The event began with a brief inauguration and judge introduction, followed by the screening of all shortlisted films before an audience of students, faculty, and guests.

The competition was judged by Mr. Naveen Kumar, a seasoned professional with over 17 years of experience in visual storytelling, video editing, and photography. His insightful feedback added immense value to the learning experience of the participants. The first prize was awarded

to "Missed Minute" directed by Maniyam Supraja Devi, a poignant narrative about how a missed call leads to a cascade of lost opportunities and introspection. The film stood out for its emotional depth, minimal dialogue, and strong visual storytelling, earning a cash prize of ₹8,000. The second prize went to "After 10:01" directed by Akash Das, a suspenseful and creatively edited short that explored the significance of timing in a romantic twist, earning a cash prize of ₹5,000.

The Turn Coat Debate, titled Virodh Vodh, was a thought-provoking and intellectually stimulating event conducted by the MVJCE Toastmasters Club as part of SWAYAM 2025. Held on 31st May 2025 at 9:30 AM in the Seminar Hall of MVJ College of Engineering, the event brought together ten articulate participants from various institutions to engage in a unique debate format that tested not only their argumentative skills but also their adaptability and presence of mind. Unlike traditional debates, the Turn Coat format required each speaker to argue both for and against a given motion, switching perspectives midway through their speech. This format challenged participants to think critically, structure their thoughts coherently, and demonstrate rhetorical agility.

Participants were given three minutes of preparation time without access to digital devices. Each speaker then delivered a three-minute speech—spending the first half supporting the motion and the second half opposing it—guided by verbal and audio cues. The judging criteria included clarity and structure, persuasiveness, transition effectiveness, and overall delivery. The event was judged by two experienced Toastmasters: Mr. Pranav H, a seasoned speaker and mentor with leadership experience in District 92, and Ms. Rachana Kulkarni, a final-year engineering student known for her communication and leadership skills.

After a series of compelling and well-articulated speeches, Ashray Krishna from *St. Joseph's University*, *Bangalore* was awarded first place, while Tom Alben, also from *St. Joseph's University*, secured second place. Both winners impressed the judges with their ability to maintain coherence across opposing viewpoints, execute seamless transitions, and deliver their arguments with confidence and charisma. Although only one prize of ₹1,000 was initially announced, both top performers were recognized based on merit.

In conclusion, *Virodh Vodh* was a resounding success, offering a powerful showcase of critical thinking, articulation, and spontaneity. It not only highlighted the intellectual depth of the participants but also reinforced the importance of open-mindedness and adaptability in public discourse.
