

Report on Graduation Day, MVJ College of Engineering 8th October 2025

MVJ College of Engineering celebrated its 38th Graduation Day on October 8, 2025, commemorating the achievements of the 2021-2025 batch. It was a memorable occasion celebrating academic excellence and the spirit of learning, marking a proud moment for the graduates, their families, and the institution while reaffirming the values of knowledge, integrity, and service.



To ensure smooth conduct and better coordination, this year's Graduation Day was organised in two sessions: the morning session for graduates from Aeronautical Engineering, Aerospace Engineering, Civil Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, ECE (Advanced Communication Technology), ECE (VLSI Technology) and Industrial IoT and the afternoon session for CSE allied streams- Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning, Computer Science and Design, Computer Science and Engineering, CSE(Data Science) and Information Science and Engineering.
